

STALLIONS FOOTBALL COACHES CONTRACT
FOR (YEAR)_____SEASON
TEAM GRADE AND COLOR_____

Our goal is to help develop “young boys to MEN beyond the goal line” by providing an environment where they will have fun and develop the values of sportsmanship, teamwork, commitment and hard work. We encourage Faith-Family Involvement- School- Football, in that order while acting as consistent and caring male role models with virtues. The following are not suggestions they are how as coaches we will act as role models and Stallion Coaches.

- Be organized. Have your practices and drills planned out, written out and timed. Be efficient with our time, keep it short. Change drills often.
- Speak with confidence and purpose. Never scream to humiliate or with fear at a player. Coach with encouragement, not fear. Never raise your voice except for praise, as this transmits to respect.
- Try to make games or contests out of your drills to make them fun.
- Get your kids plenty of water breaks. Take no chances with heat exhaustion.
- No need to have helmets on when doing cals, or chalk talks, keep the kids cool.
- Take no chances with health issues, if necessary call parent/guardian, evacuate or call for ambulance. Keep all asthma inhalers in one location.
- Have drills with group sizes 5-10, no larger and 10 minutes or less. Keep calisthenics and agility drills to an absolute minimum (no more than 10 minutes). Sprints should be kept to a minimum as well, run plays out, play Hawaiian rules football or play tag to get the conditioning in. Do lots of fit and freeze drills, keep live scrimmaging to a minimum.
- Keep live tackling drills limited to smaller spaces. We do not want 10-yard cushions for high-speed ramming type drills.
- Review in depth safe and sure blocking and tackling techniques with the head up to lessen the possibility of neck and head injuries.
- Be positive, smile, and enthusiastically encourage your players.
- Be consistent, set parameters and don't let your players go outside them.
- Encourage overt sportsmanship and class at every turn.
- Encourage teamwork.
- Do not touch a player when we appear angry. Never touch a player in any private area.
- Do not use any abusive or foul language.
- Do not smoke or drink alcohol in front of any players or parents on or off the field at any Stallion event.
- Do not wear any clothing that promotes firearms, alcohol, tobacco products or bars.
- No “Do” rags or ear rings. Keep extensive tattoo displays covered.
- Safety is our first concern; medical kits and water will be responsibility of each team.
- All players will play in every game contingent on players behavior and safety. Any violation of this rule could result in suspension and or permanent expulsion.
- We do not want any Stallion team to win by more than 4 touchdowns if we can help it. If ahead by 25 or more in quarter 4, let the other team score.

- No Stallion team is allowed to score more than 32 points over their opponents score. Be pro-active; don't put yourself in a bad position. As a precaution, tell the official to flag your team if they score.
- Call timeout and put in wholesale second offense or defense in immediately for one series when ahead by 3 touchdowns. Substitute at beginning of game and freely.
- Have 3rd string QB and running backs ready to play for above situations.
- Do not blitz, pass, run the ends, have star players handle the ball or run trick plays when up by 3 touchdowns or more.
- Do not run outside or pass when up by 3 touchdowns or more.
- Put players in unfamiliar positions when a "slaughter" is on to keep the scores reasonable and guarantee fumbles to the other team.
- When ahead comfortable late in the game, do not call timeouts, absolutely do not pass or call blitzes and stay inbounds and run the clock out. Don't sub a star or big player back in late in the game. Kneel to run out the last few ticks.
- Do not excessively celebrate big plays with such things as raised arms or booming shouts.
- Make sure your "Birth Certificate and Contract Book" is in your team possession at all practices and games.
- No arguing with officials or opposing coaches. Only talk to officials to clarify the number of the player committing the foul, asking for amount of time left or timeouts and clarifying any "Special" League rules, **NEVER QUESTION A JUDGMENT CALL EVER. Any coach that is tossed from any game can be fired.**
- **Any coach that has a penalty flag thrown on him in any game for unsportsmanship conduct could receive a automatic 1 week suspension from practice and the next game and not allowed to coach during that week and game. Second like flag in the season that coach could be fired from coaching.**
- No parents or guardian on the sidelines except for coaches. Control the crowd.
- Restrain any problem parents/guardians by asking them to tone it done. Next warning, tell them their child will be removed from the game if they do not tone it down. Next step remove the player if necessary. Put the player back in when the parent/guardian leaves the field. Have a coach help if needed.
- Refer any parent/guardian or coach complaints to head coach.
- Someone lead group prayer before or after each practice and each game. Pray for safety and good sportsmanship for us and our opponents, in Jesus name.
- Make sure snack or the like kind is distributed to our opponents after every game during the handshake line up. Invite other team to join in team prayer after games.
- If a player throws his helmet in anger or removes his shoulder pads in anger, player can be expelled from the program, collect his equipment from him on the spot if scholarship.
- No overnights.
- Report any player that has missed 2 unexcused practices in a row to the head coach.

- Retrieve equipment from scholarship players that quit immediately!
- Report any rules violations to the head coach.
- Once school starts, Thursday is academic night. All players must bring in their Academic Accountability report. Make a big deal out of it. Those that do not bring it in run, those that do, rest. Coaches must have a heart to help children of all races and economic conditions.
- Have Fun!
- All coaches must be approved in advance, pay for FBI check, pay for coaches clinics, pay for annual SportsLeader training, purchase “Winning Youth Football” book by Dave Cisar or any coaches training when necessary, absolutely no exceptions.
- They must fill out paperwork and attend clinics.
- All Head Coaches will be responsible for all equipment duties including fitting, ordering, delivering, and keeping track of all equipment. Must collect and maintain all Scholarship equipment at end of season. If the Head Coach can not attend any of these meetings he must send a responsible representative to fill in.
- Any personal Domestic Relation issues such as but not limited to, police action, arrest, or legal complaint will be subject to at least one year suspension from Stallion coaching, regardless of innocence or guilt.
- I will always act in a manner to be an excellent role model for all Stallion players.
- Bad mouthing the Stallion system, fellow coaches, or the program will not be tolerated; dissension will tear the program apart. The Stallion program is what it is and you coach accepting it 100%. We never boast it is the only way and you are free not to join or coach. By signing below you accept and promise to uphold all the principles of the Stallions within the Stallions events and in public. Your actions in public represent the Stallions.
- All team coaches meetings are never to be held in a public location, such as and not limited to, Restaurants, Sports Bar, Coffee cafes. All meetings must be in private locations, such as and not limited to, homes or the Stallion office.
- Any comments or complaints are to be channeled by Assistant Coaches through the Head Coach then Commissioners.

I agree to abide by the above guidelines as a condition of Coaching for the Stallions. I can be terminated at any time, with or without cause and will have no remedy or review. I acknowledge that I will be a role model, that players will take their cue from me. I agree to act in a way that is honorable. While the goal is to play well, the primary goal is the uplifting and proper training of young men. If I leave to coach another football team, I will not take any other Stallion player with me except family members nor encourage any Stallion player to leave the organization. Any violation of this will result in a \$250 per player fee to be paid by me to Stallion Football as well as all legal costs incurred by Stallions.
